The Town's Representative Volunteer will receive an award during the 45th annual Provincial Volunteer Awards Ceremony held on April 1st in Halifax.

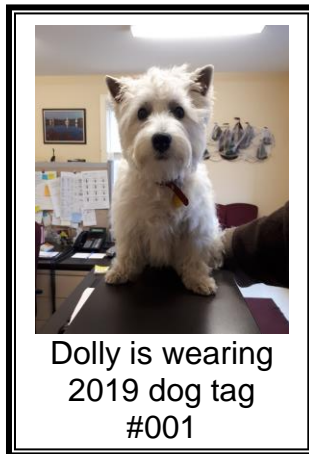

Follow the 9 p.m. Routine with Nova Scotia RCMP

The Nova Scotia RCMP are encouraging everyone to follow their new 9 p.m. Routine crime prevention campaign. They are encouraging all residents to complete the following steps at 9 p.m. each evening:

1. Remove keys, wallets, cash, garage door openers and other valuables from vehicles.
2. Ensure vehicle and home windows are shut (and locked if possible).
3. Close and lock doors on vehicles and homes.
4. Close overhead garage doors.
5. Turn on outside lights.
6. Post that you've completed the #9PMROUTINE on social media, and tag Nova Scotia RCMP
