Anti-Litter Bylaw

"Any person who litters by throwing material of any kind on any sidewalk, street, road, lane, highway, parking lot, park, cemetery or burial ground, or into any ditch, brook, river or harbor, or into or against any building or on any premises; shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00."
