
includes a clear bag, a pair of gloves and a sticker to be placed on the bag so that curbside waste haulers can identify the bags.

### **Dogs in Mahone Bay**

Mahone Bay is a dog friendly town. You don't have to walk very far to meet up with a neighbor out enjoying a walk with their dog. The Town Hall office issues dog licenses free of charge to dog owners in an effort to encourage everyone to have their pet registered. This information helps us get your dog back to you in the event that he or she gets loose.

The Town's Dog Control Bylaw explains the need for a restraint to keep dogs on owner's properties or to keep the dog under control when off property. The Bylaw also stipulates that the person who has control of the dog is responsible for cleaning up after it.

I have recently received calls and emails from citizens concerning dog feces on the sidewalks and trails of Mahone Bay. There have also been postings on social media of similar complaints. The problem is becoming even more obvious as the snow melts revealing six months of "deposits" by our canine friends.

Most owners are quite diligent in cleaning up after their dogs. I keep a roll of "doggie-doo" plastic bags on hand for those occasions when we are lucky enough to be able to dog-sit a friend's pooch. After the cleanup, the bag should be deposited in a suitable receptacle. If there is no receptacle located nearby, respectful dog owners take the bag home and dispose of it in their own garbage, they do not leave it for someone else to clean up.

Help our Town maintain a friendly relationship with our canine friends and the people who care for them:

- Get a free dog tag for your dog from Town
- Always keep your dog on your own property or on a leash when you are walking it
- Respect other people's preference to not have to get too close to a dog
- Clean up after your animal every time, regardless of where it chooses to defecate
- Dispose of the bag properly
