Solid Waste Management By-law



On October 24th, Council passed an amended Solid Waste Management By-law. Highlights of the newly amended By-law include:

- Container regulations including a switch to paper bags for leaf collection (no more plastic)
- The addition of a special collection for wood and metal which can no longer go out on bulky-waste collection day
- Addition of an electronics waste special collection date

One tree being added to the registry that has us very excited is the new permanent Christmas tree on Edgewater Street.

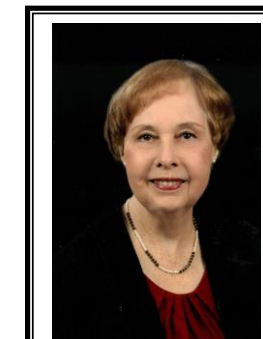

Products such as reusable covers and stashes (zero plastic reusable bags), bamboo travel mugs and stainless-steel water bottles offer alternatives for many of the single-use products that are hard habits to break.



Collapsible travel mugs and pocket straws are realistic options for those who need to have reusable products at hand for unexpected stops.

The Teazer also uses only paper shopping bags, with reusable bags available for purchase, an option popular with those who plan to do a lot of shopping while visiting Mahone Bay, says owner Sue Bourinot.
