The introduction of the first-time logo for Town Hall Services is part of a larger communications plan to brand all Town Hall activities. Information on the communications plan and the process surrounding the introduction of the logo are contained in documents associated with meetings of the town council as well as more detailed discussions in the video records of each one. The recordings also provide details around the planned uses for the new town services logo. As recorded, the intent of branding Town Hall services pertains to that and only that. The products and services originating within town hall. Other activities in the private sector as well as with independent Mahone Bay groups are unaffected. Many organizations and business in the town have their own brand/logo which will continue to be used as long as the owner chooses to do so. The logo for the Town of Mahone Bay - the 'Three Churches' logo will still apply to the town 'in a broader more general context'.

Road signs are not affected, nor will the new logo designed for town hall services be visible on our road signage. There is currently consultation underway on 'Wayfinding Signage' with the Mahone Bay Tourism and Chamber of Commerce and the public. The signage project is intended to enhance directions in the town and make it easier for visitors and tourists to find their way around the quiet streets to discover everything this town has to

offer. The anticipated implementation of the new 'Wayfinding Signage' is expected to begin early in spring. The choice of signage design will reflect the result of the consultation.

New Logo for Town Services

The prior Town of Mahone Bay logo, in limited use from 2014-2019, required replacement to meet the Town's communications needs for the 21st century, particularly the requirement for a symbol identifiable among the many other local brands featuring



literal representations of the three churches. The prior logo was an inflexible design frequently inadequate for practical use, lacking adaptability and an associated colour palette and style guide for Town communications.

The need for a new logo presented an opportunity to broaden the Town's branding to be more representative of our community and the programs and services we deliver to residents. The three diamonds in the new logo symbolize Mahone Bay's iconic three-churches reflected in the waters of the bay, but also evoke a tree line, sailboats

on the harbour or gemstones representing our treasured community.

The new logo reflects pride in our built architectural heritage but also our natural and social heritage. The choice of colours likewise reflects pride in our heritage and how our community has always been sustained by the ocean (blue), our beautiful natural environment and our responsibility to be good environmental stewards (green), and our treasured community and shared values of neighbourhood and society (gold).

The new logo will be used for official Town purposes including notices to residents, reports, bills, business cards, vehicle decals, and the Town website.

Valerie first approached Council in April 2018 with the idea of marking the Centennial Year by planting 100 years. 
