Flu Vaccine Clinics

The team at Kinburn Pharmasave have teamed up with the Town, the Mahone Bay and District Volunteer Fire Department, and the Mahone Bay and Area Lions Club to provide flu vaccine clinics that meet the public safety requirements in place for the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

The fire department has generously allowed the Pharmasave team to hold multiple vaccine clinics at the hall so that they can still provide as many flu vaccines as possible to the community.

Be sure to call the Pharmasave soon to book a time for your vaccine. You will get to see the amazing vaccine carts that the team have developed to bring

the vaccine to the patient, instead of the patient to the vaccine.



A message from the Mayor:

There have been a number of comments of late concerning crosswalk safety. Pedestrians have noted motorists not yielding to pedestrians and exceeding posted speed limits.

The Nova Scotia Motor Vehicle Act requires that:

- motorists stop and yield to pedestrians standing in or facing the curb at crosswalk;
- pedestrians crossing a street at any location other than a crosswalk, to yield the right-of-way to vehicles.
- pedestrians in a crosswalk do have the right-of-way.

Motorists and pedestrians who fail to abide by the Motor Vehicle Act are subject to penalties such as demerit points, license suspensions and fines ranging from \$500 for a first offence to \$2,000 for a third offence.

As fall turns to winter, the issue of visibility becomes critical. A morning or evening walk becomes increasingly dangerous as the visibility of a pedestrian to the motorist is reduced.

If you see a motorist who does not yield to a pedestrian, if you can, note the vehicle license number or even the type and colour of car. Then notify the RCMP at 902-634-8674. After you notify the RCMP, you can call Town Hall and ask that the issue find its way to the Police Advisory Board.

But that will be little comfort if you have been hit by a car. Please be careful.


