A Message from the Festivals of Mahone Bay




Magic is in the air. Father Christmas is back. This year the Father Christmas Festival is celebrating 19 years with a few new arrivals.

Fun Facts

The Mahone Bay solar garden is made up of 4,128 solar panels and covers almost 6 acres of land on the wastewater treatment facility property.



The solar garden produces 1.86 MW of power for the town. That is equivalent to fully powering 205 Mahone Bay homes each year!
