As the dark days of January come to an end, Mahone Bay continues to move toward a bright future. But our experience with the COVID-19 pandemic remains in the forefront. The impact of the pandemic continues to be felt here, in spite of low case numbers in NS.

Our streets are even more quiet than one would expect. Citizens of our town have chosen to adhere to the recommendations of our provincial health department. Masks, social distancing and gathering limits are the order of the day. Most of our shops and restaurants have been able to remain open on a restricted basis with lots of local support.

Businesses operating on a limited basis are experiencing difficulties in providing valuable services. Volunteer groups are affected as well. COVID-19 restrictions make it almost impossible to pursue fund raising activities. In our town it is critical that our businesses survive the pandemic. <u>Leashes</u>, according to Brian

The Town of Mahone Bay Animal Control Officer, Brian Truelove, is part of an increased push to remind people of the importance of keeping dogs secured on your



property or on leash. Keeping your dog secured is mandatory in Mahone Bay and anyone who fails to do so is subject to a fine and/or dogs found wandering at large can be confiscated by the Animal Control Officer.

In addition to the need to be sure that your dog does not bother others, Brian urges all dog owners/walkers/minders to keep dogs on lead for the dog's protection.

"If your dog is on leash, you have control of your dog and you can protect it," Brian says. In his many years working in Animal Control Brian has seen cases of dogs off-leash who get spooked and run, eventually ending up on the road with tragic results; injuries when meeting another off-leash dog; and this time of year Brian regularly learns of dogs caught in snares.

For the safety of all, including your dog, remember that leashes are the law.


