Transportation Plan

The Town Council has heard from the citizens of Mahone Bay and consulted with the experts. Now we're proposing some changes to make our streets safer and to encourage walking and cycling options.

- 1. New 3-way stop at Clearway St & Main St intersection
- 2. Additional crosswalks in 5 new locations
- 3. Improved trail crossing at Long Hill Rd & Main St intersection
- 4. New traffic calming measures on Clairmont St and Kinburn St
- 5. Changing Cherry Lane to one-way and Orchard St to one-way (to Parish St) with Parish St serving as the exit for both



The Town is waiting for a response to our application for Provincial funding to support these improvements.
