Water System Upgrade

We had our first road closure and water shut-off in July, and we're now preparing for our second one.



Monday, August 15th at 10pm until Tuesday, August 16th at 6am.

It should be noted that shut off dates are always subject to change.

We appreciate everyone's patience with this ongoing work. Our underground waterlines that go to and from our Water Treatment Plant on Zwicker Lane were installed in the 1940s and the Town is very excited about these upgrades, which are hoped to be the first of several such projects in coming years. Living Shoreline

Coastal Action is wrapping up the construction phase Living Shoreline Pilot project!




A living shoreline provides protection from flooding, erosion, and storm surge through nature-based infrastructure as opposed to the hard rock armouring typically seen along Nova Scotia coastlines. This innovative project will also filter stormwater runoff, stabilize the shoreline bank, reduce wave energy, and enhance coastal habitat. We hope this pilot project will assist in securing support to complete the Living Shoreline all along Edgewater Street.

Tick Safety


Spring is in the air! We're all excited to get out and enjoy the spring weather but we need to remember that with the return of warm weather comes the return of ticks.


Nova Scotia has many types of ticks but the one of most concern for the spread of Lyme Disease is the blacklegged tick.








Are you locked up and secure for the night?

Join the #9PMRoutine today and take an active role in crime prevention in your neighbourhood and community.

The #9PMRoutine is a campaign used by police agencies across North America to remind citizens to protect themselves and their property.

What Do I Need to Do?

There are simple steps you can take to help prevent crime in your neighbourhood. Every night at 9 PM:

- Remove valuables from your vehicle and ensure it's locked, windows are closed, and if possible, your vehicle's parked in a garage.
- Close all garage windows and lock any garage doors, especially those leading into your house.
- Keep your vehicle registration and insurance documents secure. The documents can be used to commit other crimes.
- Check and lock all house doors and shut all windows.
- Turn on an exterior light.
- Close and lock your fence gate.
- Lock your shed.
- Put away bikes and toys in your yard.
- Park in the garage instead of the street, if possible.

Municipal Boundary Review

The Municipal Boundary Review is a process conducted every eight years in which the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board requires that municipal councils submit an application for the size of Council.

Council has declared their preference for a Council comprised of six Councillors plus a mayor. Their final decision will be made following the period of public consultation, but this preference is to stimulate conversation in the community. What do you think? Is this the right size for Mahone Bay?

EV Chargers & Tickets

EV Statistics

Visitors are charging up in Mahone Bay this summer! Our recently installed electric vehicle chargers have seen



over 375 hours of use since being installed last winter. This is allowing visitors to take advantage of our green energy while touring the Town! You can find these chargers located at Town Hall, Clairmont Street (by the Pharmasave), Main Street (at Clearway), the Mahone Bay Centre, the Mahone Bay Civic Marina, and the new Fire Station.

<u>Cigarette Butts</u>



Have you noticed these cigarette butt recycling stations around town?

Located around town these stations are emptied regularly by staff. The cigarette filters are sent away and are melted into a hard plastic that can be

Solid Waste Management Bylaw



The Town has adopted an amended Solid Waste Management By-law which excludes hidden plastic contaminants from the organics stream. This by-law is effective

November 1, 2022 and bans items with waxy or plastic coating such as some disposable food containers and plastic compost liners. Watch for more information to come.
