Update from the Community Logo Steering Team

Based on community feedback, in 2022 the Mahone Bay Town Council established the Community Logo Development Steering Team (consisting of 2 council and 7 public members) with a mandate to develop a new community logo for Mahone Bay for recommendation to Council.

The Steering Team first met in February 2023. In April of 2023 the Steering Team conducted a community survey to inform the development of a new logo. Community feedback strongly indicated that a new logo should be as similar as possible to the former "three churches" logo used by the Town during the period of 2014-2019. At the recommendation of the Steering Team, the Town acquired the rights to the former "three churches" logo from the Mahone Bay Tourism & Chamber of Commerce, who originally developed it, and in October 2023, issued a request for proposals for the update of the former "three churches" logo; The contract was awarded to Ross Graphics in November 2023.

The contracted logo update would:

- -Include the words "Town Of"
- -Ensure optimal usability for a variety of applications -Align with the Town's existing colour scheme

This grant helps lowincome seniors with the cost of household services like lawn care, snow



removal, grocery delivery, transportation and small home repairs. Seniors can also apply for help with costs associated with health care services like physiotherapy and mental health support.
