# **Living Shoreline**



The team at Coastal Action has been working on a living shoreline pilot project along a 60m portion of Edgewater Street across from the Three Churches. This project picks up from the Town's previous work to develop the concept of a living shoreline for Edgewater Street. A living shoreline provides protection from flooding, erosion, and storm surge through nature-based infrastructure as opposed to the hard rock armouring typically seen along Nova Scotia coastlines. Coastal Action began this project in 2020, and successfully completed a geotechnical study at the pilot site last fall.

Construction on this project is expected to begin June 16th and last for approximately two months. During this time, the Anglican Church parking lot will be closed for public use. The walking trail along the parking lot will also be closed, with pedestrian traffic rerouted along the Edgewater St sidewalk. Parking in the Anglican Church lot will be made available on Sundays for parishioners of the church. For the duration of this closure, the Bookmobile will be located in the Lutheran Church parking lot.

June is national Pride month and the pride flag will be flying on the community flagpole for the month of June.

Mahone Bay strives to be a community where everyone feels welcome.

# Water System Upgrade

We're working on an upgrade to the 1940s era water lines to and from the water treatment plant on Zwicker Lane.



During the month of June we anticipate one or two overnight water disruptions as well traffic disruptions on Main Street in the vicinity of the new nursing home site. Traffic will at times be reduced to one lane and traffic safety personnel will be on site to provide support.

Please be sure to watch for information on the date(s) of the water shut down.

Or you can follow the trail to Chester or do an about face and follow the trail back.

Everywhere you look you will see the town's preparations for the summer season when we entertain so many visitors and returning citizens on vacation.

Mahone Bay is one of only 5 municipal electric utilities in Nova Scotia. This puts us in a unique position to lead the way in decarbonizing our electricity. 42% of Mahone

Bay's electricity comes from the Ellershouse Windfarm, which is co-owned by Mahone Bay, Antigonish, and Berwick.

When the Community Solar Garden project is complete, an additional 16% of the Town's energy will come from locally owned, renewable sources! This project represents a big step towards Mahone Bay's goal of providing clean renewable power and reducing emissions...

# **Sports Field Update**

Work has started on a project to improve the condition of the sports field by the Mahone Bay



Centre. This project is a partnership between the Town of Mahone Bay and Mahone Bay United Soccer Club.

A culvert will be placed to improve drainage (and therefore the condition of the playing surface) and while that work is happening, the power lines will be moved underground to improve safety of the field for all users. A new accessible walking track around the outside of the field is also planned as part of this project, to encourage outdoor recreation for all.

This work will impact the use of the sports field this year but we look forward to much improved playing conditions for the future.

# Solid Waste Management By-law

The Town has adopted an amended Solid Waste Management By-law which excludes hidden plastic contaminants from the organics stream. This by-law is

effective November 1, 2022 and bans items with waxy or plastic coating such as some disposable food containers and plastic compost liners. Watch for more information to come.
