

Living Shoreline



Just a FRIENDLY REMINDER that if you are from Mahone Bay or just visiting us, please NO FOOT TRAFFIC on the rocks, bank, or wetland area of our Living Shoreline!

Here is WHY: First and foremost, the rocks are UNSAFE to climb or walk on at anytime! Secondly, our vegetated bank and wetland are still trying to grow and establish, they can only do so if they are not stepped on or compacted. This establishment period is CRUCIAL for the long-term survival of the plants and newly restored tidal ecosystem.

We understand that the site currently looks like a great place to spend time, but we ask that you please enjoy the site from the safety of the walking path.

The Town of Mahone Bay has a Civic Address By-law which states that every

property owner is responsible to post the civic number of the property on the same side of the road as the building with that number


Civic numbers shall be on both sides of the sign and perpendicular to the street.

The numerals shall be white on reflective blue background.

The civic number shall be posted on a dedicated vertically mounted post, no further than 3m (10') from the edge of the road, and between 1m and 1.5m from the road surface.

EV Chargers and Tickets



The electric vehicle charging parking spots around town are only for EV's and only to be used when they are charging.

Non-EV's or EV's that are not charging are in violation and subject to parking fines.

Doggy Etiquette



You've heard us prattle on about this many times! But we want to remind everyone that in Mahone Bay, every dog

owner who fails to remove their dog's feces from public or private property (other than their own) is guilty of an offense and subject to a fine of at least \$150.

We've been hearing reports of people putting their used dog waste bags in other people's garbage bins and composters, this is also an offence in Mahone Bay, under the Town's Solid Waste Management Bylaw.

It is also important to note that dog waste belongs in the trash, it is not compostable.

Rum Runners Relay



The Rum Runners Relay will be held on Saturday, September 24th. The relay begins in Timberlea and ends in Lunenburg.

On the 24th we ask that all drivers be extra cautious and watch out for runners along the edges of our streets and roads.
