- ❖ If you have not yet registered your dog for his or her 2017 Dog Tag, please come to Town Hall to get your FREE dog tag. Dog registration must be renewed every calendar year. There is no fee to register your dog (but there is a \$5 fee for a replacement tag). Registering your dog helps us get your pooch home quickly.

## Road Construction Summer 2017

The Town of Mahone Bay is working with an engineer to develop designs for water main replacement and storm/wastewater separation on Pleasant and Clairmont Streets.

This work will happen in the summer of 2017 and residents should expect significant traffic disruption on those roads due to street excavation.



More information about what to expect will be released once designs have been finalized.



## Winter Parking Ban

The Town of Mahone Bay follows the winter parking ban, in accordance with Section 139 of the Motor Vehicle Act. Vehicles shall not be left, attended or unattended, on a street or part of a street in a way that obstructs snow removal during or after a storm, or in any way obstructs winter maintenance such as salting. Vehicles that are in the way of road maintenance will be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense.

A reminder that in the event of a snow storm on Waste Collection Day, please remember to keep your waste bins, particularly your Green Carts, off the streets and sidewalks to avoid interference with snow clearing.
