Protecting our Bay with wastewater treatment!





PUMP, PUMP PUMP IT UP

We pump wastewater up from the shoreline for treatment before it enters the ecosystem. With rising sea levels, our pumping stations need bailing out!

FIRST-RATE TREATMENT

Wastewater is treated in lagoons via biological oxidation. We must work together to separate our stormwater out: by it's nature, it doesn't need treatment.





KEEPING THE HARBOUR BEAUTIFUL

We're working to protect aquatic life by removing the chlorine from the treatment process and connecting older residences to the public wastewater system.

A wastewater system that keeps our Bay safe.

The first phases in Mahone Bay's wastewater system were complete in 1949 in the most expensive project we'd ever undertaken. Now we have a modern facility and soon we'll add a peracetic acid system to ensure no excess chlorine reaches the bay. Heavier rains and higher waves from climate change are imposing new costs. Diagnostics help us to make smart investments for the future, ensuring your utility payments are used wisely!
