We are also looking at options to support the use of bi-directional chargers.

# Are you locked up and secure for the night?

Join the #9PMRoutine today and take an active role in crime prevention in your neighhourhood and community.

The #9PMRoutine is a campaign used by police agencies across North America to remind citizens to protect themselves and their property.

What do I need to do?

There are simple steps you can take to help prevent crime in your neighbourhood.

Every night at 9pm:

- Remove valuables from your vehicle and ensure it's locked and windows are closed.
- Close all garage windows and lock any garage doors, especially those leading into your house
- Keep your vehicle registration and insurance documents secure. The documents can be used to commit other crimes
- Check and lock all house doors and shut all windows
- Turn on an exterior light
- Close and lock your fence gate
- Lock your shed
- Put away bikes and toys in your yard
- Park in the garage instead of the street, if possible.

Trees are extremely important to us as individuals and to the Town. ### EV Charger Statistics



Our electric vehicle chargers have been used over 3,014 hours, representing over 1,471 individual charging sessions since being installed in 2021.

This is allowing visitors to take advantage of our green energy while enjoying our Town!

### <u>Seniors Care Grant</u>

This grant helps lowincome seniors with the cost of household services like lawn care, snow



removal, grocery delivery, transportation and small home repairs. Seniors can also apply for help with costs associated with health care services like physiotherapy and mental health support. Grants are \$750 per household. If you qualify, you can apply until March 31, 2024. To learn more visit
