A reminder that all dogs in Mahone Bay are required to be registered every year. Dog registration is FREE and annual registration helps us get your



dog back to you as quickly as possible in the event that he or she is lost.

If you have not yet registered your dog, please come to Town Hall to get your dog's FREE tag. (And we would love to meet your dog)

- Remember that dogs must be on leash and under control of the person walking the dog when not on private property
- Remember to stoop and scoop!

Yard Clean-up

Limbs can be placed curbside in your green bin



with your other organics but make sure that the lid closes on the green bin. You can also put branches and limbs out on green week if they are tied in manageable bundles, or in clear or paper bags. Individual pieces should be no more than 3 feet long and no larger than 2 inches in diameter.

Mobile Speed Signs Have Arrived

These digital speed signs display driving speeds to encourage safe driving in our town. The signs also collect traffic data which we will share with the RCMP as part of our ongoing partnership to protect the public safety of our residents and visitors. Placement of
