## Road Reconstruction 2017 Update

We are very nearly finished the 2017 Road Reconstruction Project and in these last days we are seeing the construction crews finish the final details



Temporary water mains have been removed, driveways have been blended into the new sidewalks and road surfaces and much of the landscaping has been completed.

Much of the paving has been completed. Crews are completing concrete work that needs to be done by hand and when that is finished, the final paving will be done.

Thank you to the residents and businesses who have embraced these improvements and road works with a positive attitude and a warm welcome to the construction crews who have been in town this summer and fall. We are all eager for the final product, which we hope to see in the very near future.

#### Winter Parking Ban



The Town of Mahone Bay follows the winter parking ban, in accordance with Section 139 of the Motor Vehicle Act. No person shall willfully park or leave standing a vehicle, attended or

unattended, on a street or part thereof which interferes or obstructs snow removal during or after a snow storm, or in any way obstructs winter maintenance, i.e. salting. Such vehicles will be ticketed or towed away at the owner's expense.

#### Mahone Bay is an On-Leash Town

All dogs in Mahone Bay are to be kept on leash when off the owner's property and under control of the person walking the dog. For animal control, please contact Town Hall.
