Road Reconstruction 2017 Update

We are very pleased to see the first layer of asphalt on Pleasant Street and Clairmont Street. There are a few areas where hand work is required on the curbs before the first layer of asphalt can be laid down.



Over the next couple of weeks, we will see crews raising the manhole covers, dismantling the temporary water mains, blending driveways into new sidewalks and road surfaces, landscaping and general clean up.

We are all grateful to the residents and businesses of Mahone Bay for their patience throughout the project. We aren't quite finished yet, but we are close and now that we are at the finishing stages, the roads are going to look a lot better with each step of this process.

Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to bring their concerns to Town Hall staff so that issues can be addressed. We have received a lot of positive feedback from the public as we all eagerly await the finished project.

Clearway Street Construction
