We're having an election, Mahone Bay!



By now you should have received a notice in the mail asking for you to return your information for the voter's list to the office by October 19th. This information ensures that we have the most accurate information for the election.

Nov 26th - Ordinary Polling Day

As in the 2022 Municipal Election we will be conducting this election using phone or online voting. In the days to come we will send out detailed instructions on how that process works, and we will have Election Staff available to assist, both for those who choose to vote from home and those who come out for a Polling Day.

### **QE II Platinum Jubilee Medal**



We are proud to share the news that Councillor Richard Nowe was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal on October 1, 2022.

This award was created to mark the 70th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's reign to honour significant contributions and achievements; to be eligible for the medal, recipients must be shown to have made a significant contribution to their community.

Councillor Nowe is a longtime volunteer in our community: he has volunteered on the Fire Department for almost 50 years; he is a long-standing member of the Mahone Bay and District Lion's Club; he works with the Mahone Bay Food Bank; he was a founding member of the Mahone Bay Saint John's Ambulance Brigade; a member of the (first responders) Critical Incident Stress Management Team; as well as a volunteer with Little League Baseball and the Scouting movement.



# Community Logo Development Steering Team Deadline Extended!

We are looking for members of a Community Logo Development Steering Team to oversee the



development of a Mahone Bay Community Logo.

The community logo will be for the use of the Town of Mahone Bay and other parties as licensed by the Town. We are looking for up to seven members of the public to work with two members of Council appointed to this limited time steering team.

### **Natural Asset Inventory Project**

We've been so happy to have had the chance to work with GIS Technician Jacob Albury this summer, and we're delighted with the information that he has captured.

Jacob's projects included mapping Park Cemetery as well as the natural assets in Mahone Bay, including wetlands and trees. This information is an important component in the long-term planning for the Town.

### **EV Chargers & Tickets**



Reminder - the Electrical Vehicle charger parking spots around town are only for EV's and only to be used when they are charging. Non-EV's or EV's that

are not charging are in violation and subject to parking fines.

### Solid Waste Management Bylaw



No Plastic in the compost!



The Town has adopted an amended Solid Waste Management By-law which excludes hidden plastic

contaminants from the organics stream. This by-law is effective November 1, 2022 and bans items with waxy or plastic coating such as some disposable food containers and plastic compost liners.

### **EV Statistics**

We're so excited by how much use our electric vehicle chargers have been seeing!

Our EV chargers have been used

over 810 hours since being installed last winter. This is allowing visitors to take advantage of our green energy while touring the Town! You can find these chargers located at Town Hall, Clairmont Street (by the Pharmasave), Main Street (at Clearway), the Mahone Bay Centre, the Mahone Bay Civic Marina, and the new Fire Station.

### Community Solar Garden

On site work included enhancing the stormwater management in advance of the Fiona storm system with additional "rip rap" (large stones) and hay bales. We're happy to say that these extra measures were effective.

The fence installation is now complete and solar modules and inverters have been delivered to the site. Steel pile (foundations for the solar panels) installation is expected to be completed this month and the final civil inspections will take place in October.

### **Municipal Boundary Review**



Thank you to everyone who participated by sharing their comments on size of Council and polling districts. Having

heard from the community, Council will make their application to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSUARB) for a Council made up of six Councillors based on the following reasons:

- to ensure adequate diversity of perspectives and representation that reflect the community
- to ensure effective distribution of increasing workload demands faced by Council
- to foster ease of access and communication for elected officials with community members

Council will also apply for Mahone Bay to remain undivided by polling districts.

The next step in this process is for the NSUARB to schedule an independent public hearing in our community; the Town will help spread information about that hearing when we learn the details from the NSUARB.

### **Public Input Session**

Now that the in-person gallery is open to the public again, the Public Input Session is also in-person. The 15 minutes prior to the start of regular Council meetings is an opportunity to share your opinions with Council.


